Promoting DSW Platform in Partners' Countries

A number of national conferences has been organized in Cyprus, Greece, Romania and Italy to promote the main result of the DigitalSkillsWallet, the DSW Platform.



National Conference in Cyprus



On 2nd of July 2026, EDITC, CCS, and MMC jointly organized a dissemination event at Pralina Experience in Nicosia, attracting a total of 80 participants. The event brought together representatives from both the public and private sectors, including educators, ministry officials, HR managers, and IT professionals. During the event, Ms. Maria Knais of EDITC presented the project platform, Ms. Christiana Kolokotronis introduced the framework developed within the project, and Mr. Toumazis showcased the project's key deliverables and achievements. Mr. Pratsos was a guest speaker and held a workshop for AI in education. The event provided an excellent opportunity for stakeholders to learn about the project's outcomes, exchange views, and explore the potential impact of its results across different sectors.



National Conference in Greece



The Digital Skills Wallet information event was held on 11 June 2026 at the DIMITRA Educational Organisation in Volos, with around 90 participants attending in person and online.

Organised within the Digital Skills Wallet project, it introduced the platform, micro-credentials, flexible learning pathways and the AI Learning Assistant. Nikos Mandrekas, Technology Director of DIMITRA, presented the project's objectives, platform functions, registration process, learning opportunities and future development.

Participants included students, educators, employees, unemployed learners, employers and organisational representatives. Feedback was highly positive, particularly regarding the live platform demonstration, micro-credentials and personalised AI support.

Attendees requested further information on certification, credential recognition, data protection, course availability and future platform expansion plans.



National Conference in Romania

The event was organized in a hybrid format and took place on 24 June 2026, at the Teacher Training Centre, Braila.

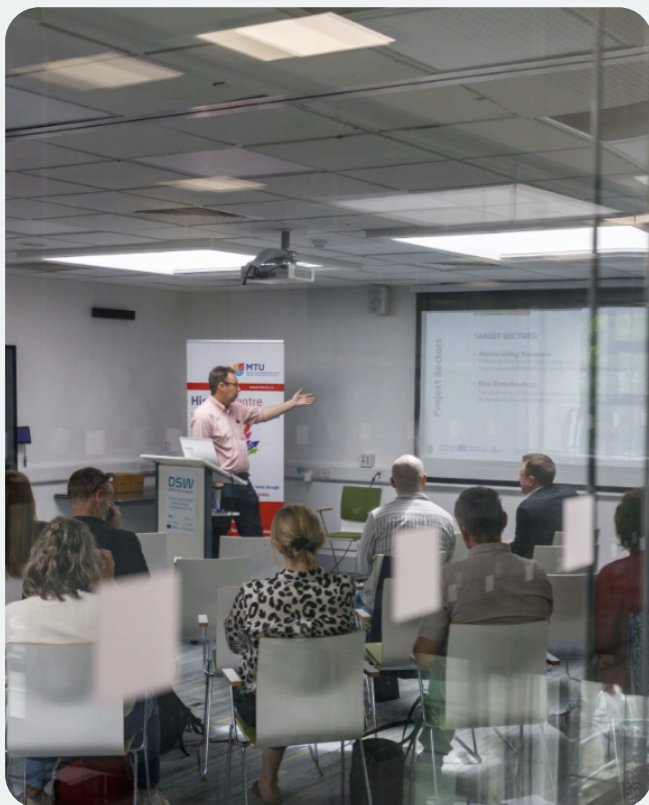
The event was addressed to teachers from preuniversity education, as well as trainers from companies and educational organizations. The event focused on the digital competences required for the effective use of AI-based tools in creating questions, designing lesson plans, generating educational resources, and improving teaching and assessment activities.

The comments from conference conveys a positive perception of the DSW platform, especially the platform's support for self-paced and flexible learning, the usefulness of the learning videos, the clarity of the interface, and the contribution of the experience to their long-term digital learning pathways.





National Conference in Ireland



The Digital Skills Wallet conference, "Future-Proof Yourself: Building Digital Competence for Life," was held on 11 June 2026 at Munster Technological University, Cork, with hybrid participation via Zoom.

Hosted by the Hincks Centre for Entrepreneurship Excellence, the event featured thirteen sessions on trust, media literacy, micro-credentials, artificial intelligence, creativity, sustainability, cybersecurity and the Digital Skills Wallet platform.

Fifty-nine participants attended, including academic, research, professional and technical staff, PhD candidates and external guests.

Feedback was consistently positive, highlighting the programme's breadth, engaging discussions and relevance to lifelong learning, digital inclusion and business.

Speakers also explored unresolved questions about qualifications, artistic research and professional development in transdisciplinary contexts across diverse community settings.



National Conference in Italy

In Italy two dissemination events were organised to present the project's objectives, achievements, and innovative approach to the acquisition, assessment, and certification of digital competences through micro-credentials aligned with the European DigComp framework. The project developed an online platform enabling learners to assess their digital skills, earn micro-credentials, and receive personalised learning pathways.

The online event held on 25 June was primarily addressed to students. It introduced the Digital Skills Wallet project, explained the concept of micro-credentials and the DigComp framework, demonstrated the platform's main features, and presented the opportunities it offers for lifelong learning and digital skills recognition.

The in-person event held on 23 July at the International Telematic University UNINETTUNO in Rome was mainly targeted at educators and teaching professionals. Participants explored the European competence frameworks (DigComp, GreenComp, and EntreComp), learned about the project's outcomes, attended practical demonstrations of the Digital Skills Wallet platform, heard testimonials from users, and engaged in discussions with the project team on the future of digital competence certification and micro-credentials in Europe.
